WHAT ARE EXPUNCTIONS?

Expunctions remove past dismissed charges and convictions of misdemeanors and minor felonies on eligible criminal records by a court order. Without pro bono volunteers, these would otherwise appear on background checks when applying for housing and employment.

PRO BONO EXPECTATIONS:

<u>Before</u>: The Advocacy Center staff determines case eligibility. We only refer eligible clients.

<u>During</u>: Meet with clients to discuss their expungeable offenses and petition.

After After filing the petition, some client contact is necessary.

Attorneys occasionally must go to court to complete proceedings.

Time: 5-10 hours
